AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 14-01-02-2014 BY DELETION AND ADDITION OF SOME PROVISIONS THEREOF, PURSUANT TO MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2022-083 ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT, DATED JUNE 15, 2022, AND REPUBLIC ACT 7160 OR THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 62, Rule XIII of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of the Republic Act No. 7160 or the Local Government Code of 1991, it mandates the Local Government Units to promote the establishment and operation of People's Organization, Non-Government Organization, and the private sector, to make them active partners in the pursuit of the local autonomy;

WHEREAS, the Department of the Interior and Local Government issued Memorandum Circular No. 2022-083, dated June 15, 2022, which provides the guidelines on the accreditation of the CSOs and selection of its representative to the Local Special Bodies, to strengthen their participation in local planning and development to further improve the delivery of basic services of the Local Government Unit;

WHEREAS, the Committee on Cooperatives, POs, NGOs, CSOs and Livelihood conducted a Committee Hearing relative to the foregoing injunction on the 5th day of August, 2022. It was agreed favorably that some provisions of Provincial Ordinance No. 14-01-02-2014 be amended accordingly;

WHEREFORE, on motion of SP Member Stephen Paul L. Uy, duly and jointly seconded by SP Members Rotchie M. Ravelo, Harold A. Montes, Daud V. Linsag, Rustan R. Castillones, Eleuterio C. Manaytay, and Anna Cheryl N. Castro, it was

Be it ordained by the 17th Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Davao Oriental, in session duly assembled that:

SECTION 1. Section 5, Definition of Terms.

5.1 xxx

- 5.7 <u>Indigenous Peoples Organization (IPO)</u> refers to a private, nonprofit, voluntary organization of members of indigenous cultural communities (ICCs) or Indigenous Peoples (IPs), which are accepted as representatives of such ICCs or IPs;
- <u>Civic Organization</u>- refers to any local service club, fraternal society or association, volunteer group, or local civic league or association not organized for profit but operated exclusively for education or charitable purposes, including the promotion of community welfare, and the net earnings of which are devoted exclusively to charitable, educational, recreational of social welfare purposes;
- 5.9 <u>Cooperative</u> refers to an autonomous and duly registered association of persons with a common bond of interests who have voluntarily joined together to achieve their social, economic, and cultural needs and aspirations and making equitable contributions to the capital required, patronizing their products and services and accepting a fair share of risks and benefits of the undertaking in accordance with the universally accepted cooperative principles;
- 5.10 <u>Social Movement</u> refer to a large informal grouping of individuals or organizations that aims to affect social change through sustained, organized and collective action.
- 5.11 <u>Professional Group</u> refers to a duly incorporated non-stock corporation of registered professionals established for the benefit and welfare of the professionals of one discipline, for the advancement of the profession itself and for the other professional ends;
- 5.12 <u>Business Group</u> refers to a non-stock corporation composed of businesses in the same industry established to pursue the interest of the industry;

SECTION 2. Section 6. Accreditation Requirements is hereby amended by deleting item:

6.10 "Must operate in at least two (2) municipalities;

SECTION 3. Section 7. Procedures.

7.1 xxx

7.3 The CSOs and PSOs shall submit three (3) hard copies and one (1) soft copy, each of all the requirements to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan through the SP Secretary, to be distributed to the following: one (1) copy for the Chairman of the Committee on Cooperatives, POs, NGOs, CSOs and Livelihood; one (1) hard copy and one (1) soft copy for the SP Secretary and one (1) file copy for the CSOs & POs & other similar aggrupation of this province, applying for accreditation;

SECTION 4. <u>Separability Clause.</u> If any portion or section of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the other sections.

SECTION 5. <u>Repealing/Amending Clause.</u> Ordinances or resolutions which are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SECTION 6. <u>Effectivity Clause.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
