PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 17-27-12-2023

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE HONORABLE NELSON R. DAYANGHIRANG, JR., PROVINCIAL VICE-GOVERNOR, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE SANGGUNIANG PANLALAWIGAN OF DAVAO ORIENTAL, TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT AGREEMENT WITH SOFTTECH SOLUTIONS AND SERVICES, REPRESENTED BY ITS GENERAL MANAGER, MR. JOSELITO Q. EDONG, FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF RESOLUTIONS AND ORDINANCES TRACKING SYSTEM (ROTS).

WHEREAS, Section 468 of the Local Government Code of 1991 (RA 7160) provides for the powers, duties and functions of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, among other things, to enact ordinances and pass resolutions necessary for an efficient and effective provincial government;

WHEREAS, recognizing the limitations of a manual tracking system to manage its legislative measures after relying on it for several years, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Davao Oriental has decided to adopt an efficient and modernized system for tracking and managing the resolutions and ordinances of the provincial government;

WHEREAS, SoftTech Solutions and Services, represented by its General Manager, Mr. *Joselito Q. Edong*, is engaged in the business of providing expertise, development tools and resources for system development, web programs development, website development, server-

based platform web hosting, e-mail services, domain registration, designed to address the website and e-mail hosting requirements of individuals, corporate entities and/or professional organizations;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan intends to avail the expertise and capabilities of the SoftTech Solutions and Services to provide a comprehensive software for managing and tracking of resolutions and ordinances;

WHEREAS, with a centralized platform for tracking and managing legislative data, the Resolutions and Ordinances Tracking System (ROTS) can help to enhance the transparency, accountability, and accessibility of resolutions and ordinances to the general public, as well as streamline administrative processes within the Provincial Government;

WHEREFORE, on motion of SP Member Marietta D. Palmera, duly and jointly seconded by SP Members Daud V. Linsag, Shella Marie S. Go, Anna Cheryl N. Castro, Andy A. Monday, and Harold A. Montes, it was

Be it ordained by the 17th Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Davao Oriental, in session duly assembled that:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY – Pursuant to Section 466(a)(5) of RA 7160, the Honorable Nelson R. Dayanghirang, Jr., Provincial Vice-Governor, is hereby granted an authority, on behalf of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Davao Oriental, to enter into a Contract of Agreement with the SoftTech Solutions and Services, represented by its General Manager, Mr. Joselito Q. Edong, for the implementation of Resolutions and Ordinances Tracking System (ROTS).

SECTION 2. The Contract Agreement between two parties shall outline the terms and conditions of mutual obligations and shall be subject to the relevant provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991, Government Procurement Reform Act, and other applicable laws, rules, and regulations.

SECTION 3. REPEALING CLAUSE – All existing measures with a provision or provisions which are inconsistent with this ordinance, the same are hereby amended or repealed accordingly.

SECTION 4. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE – Should any provision of this Ordinance is found invalid and declared unconstitutional; the rest of the provisions not otherwise affected shall remain effective and enforceable.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVITY – This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.


ENACTED: DECEMBER 11, 2023


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
